Cell Phone Policy Update:

Over the past year, we've implemented a cell phone policy requiring phones to be turned off and stored in backpacks during school hours, except for emergency use. Unfortunately, we've observed a troubling trend, impacting a concerning number of students but particularly some our female students, who are using the brief moments between classes to enter bathrooms and use their phones. This not only goes against our policy but also causes them to be late for class.

Our main priority is to ensure a strong educational experience for all students. We ask for your support in reinforcing this policy by discussing it with your child and emphasizing the importance of creating a respectful learning environment. Together, as partners, we can address this issue effectively.

As a reminder, using cell phones in the bathroom will result in the phone being confiscated until the end of the school day. Repeated violations will lead to detention.

Recent research highlights the potential risks of excessive cell phone use among teens, with studies linking it to increased anxiety, depression, and sleep deprivation, particularly in young teen girls. Many teens report feeling addicted to their devices, checking their phones hourly, or feeling compelled to respond to notifications immediately. This behavior has been shown to negatively affect mental health, academic performance, and social interactions, emphasizing the need for proactive support from both parents and schools.

We kindly ask for your support (and partnership) in speaking with your children to ensure they keep their phones stowed away during school hours.

**The research on teen cell phone use and addiction comes from various studies conducted by institutions like King's College London, the National Institute for Health Research (NIHR), and other academic sources. These studies have been published in reputable journals and online platforms, providing insights into the correlation between smartphone use and mental health issues among adolescents.

Project Updates: New Growth and Development:

- Wyoming Campus Parking Lot: Plans are to add +90 parking spaces. Begin construction summer 2026. Completion August 2026.
- Montessori Village Green: Ages 3 months through VPK. Begin construction of a 12,000 square foot Early Childhood Center on the Eldron campus, summer 2025. Opening June 2026.
- Odyssey Preparatory Academy: Kindergarten 8th grade new building featuring Cambridge program for 6-8th grades. Begin construction summer 2026. Open June 2027. Development delays.

2. Healthy School Lunch Program: From Garden to Plate

Our Healthy café staff has made impactful changes this year to our school meals by eliminating harmful glyphosates and seed oils. Our break-

fasts and lunches continue to feature fresh, nutrient-rich meals sourced from our gardens and farm when possible. Nutrition education is also infused into gardening courses, teaching students how what they eat directly influences their health and well-being.



3. Mental Health and Emotional Well-Being

Supporting mental and emotional health is a cornerstone of Odyssey's holistic mission. Alongside the continued implementation of Positive Disci-

pline in the Classroom by Jane Nelsen, we have introduced the Resiliency Florida initiative, which provides monthly guides to help students build grit, perseverance, emotional regulation, and problem-solving skills. 4. Physical Fitness: Fitness for Life

Odyssey is embarking on a transformative journey to redefine Physical Education (PE) as Fitness for Life to encourage lifelong health and wellness in our students. Inspired by SPARK: The Revolution-

ary New Science of Exercise and the Brain, PE teachers are completing professional development to transition their roles into Personal Trainers and Wellness Coaches. This summer, new PE curricula will be mapped out to align to the Fitness for Life goals, making sure to continue programs like the Annual 5K Run, Presidential Youth Fitness Program, and American Heart Month.
